Time to break out those thinking caps and get those creative juices flowing, Mayfair Park. The MPNA is looking to get the ball rolling on our very own Mayfair Park neighborhood signs to display on various light poles around the neighborhood. You probably have noticed our surrounding neighborhoods have signs of their own, and it's long over due that we display some of our own. Before we do that, we first need to come up with a logo/graphic that best exemplifies Mayfair Park.

This is where you come in. We are leaving the design of the logo up to our residents. Beginning now, through August 12th, we will be accepting Mayfair Park graphic design logos. Please email your logo design to millstw21@yahoo.com. Cutoff date for all applicants will be on 8/12. Then during our annual meeting on 8/17 we'll vote on which graphic best represents our neighborhood. Following the meeting we'll submit the design to the city to begin the approval process.



Once approved by the city, it'll be sent in for manufacturing. Not only will the graphic be displayed on light poles around the neighborhood, it will also be applied to our Mayfair Park website. It will become the official logo of our neighborhood that we will proudly display.

Inspiration of the design can come from anywhere. For example: Water tower off Burleigh Road, schools along Center Street, our abundance of trees throughout the neighborhood, or the friendly/caring people that make up Mayfair Park. Whatever you think makes our neighborhood shine! We just ask the words "Mayfair Park" be incorporated into the logo, and that it be submitted in either JPEG, PNG or PDF format. In addition to sending us your graphic we would love to hear your inspiration and meaning behind the design. Need assistance hauling off larger items to the city dump? Look no further! A fellow MPNA active member has generously offered to make scheduled trips to the Wauwatosa Drop Off Center (11100 W. Walnut Road). He'll provide the entry pass and transportation, which includes his trailer that'll accommodate most items. This service is available for any Mayfair Park resident with large items, that you're looking to dispose of, that you're unable to haul away yourself. Such items include - but not limited to - furniture, larger tree branches, kitchen appliances, carpeting, etc. If needed (and if available), the board can provide additional manpower to help lift any heavy items onto the trailer. If a large storm would happen to rip through our neighborhood, and we receive an abundance of requests, we'll schedule a day to assist anyone who contacted us in regards to their downed trees/branches. Tree trunks and large branches will need to be cut up to fit on trailer.



The only thing that will be required is that the resident will need to cover any costs the Drop Off Center charges. For further information about the dump, such as fees and an extensive list of what the dumps accepts, please visit the **Public Works Department** page at Wauwatosa.net. This service should not be confused with items that are typically put out for curbside yard waste pickup the city takes care of every other week. This is only for larger items that Wauwatosa won't collect during their scheduled yard waste pickup days.

To schedule a pickup with us please contact a board member of the MPNA. The list of board members, and our emails, are available on **Page 3** of newsletter. All requests will be subjected to the availability of the trailer. We will certainly do our best to address all inquiries as time permits.

FARMERS MARKETS

Tosa Farmers Market runs from June 1st through October 12th each Saturday from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. at 7720 Harwood Ave (Hart Mills Parking Lot).

Every Saturday, this open-air market will host roughly 45 farmers and food producers, selling a mix of produce, flowers, baked goods, cheese, coffee, waffles, popsicles, fish, meat and poultry, and prepared breakfast and dinner items. The first Saturday of each month, they add a Makers Market, featuring a selection of local artisans selling handmade arts and crafts.
